From time to time, someone may knock on your door to sell you a product or a service. When they do, ask to see their soliciting permit. Soliciting in Morristown is not allowed without a permit. Permits are obtained by stopping at the Village Office or by calling 740-782-1551.

School-age children in the Union Local School District and religious organizations are not required to have a permit.
